Is this a good question?


Have we identified relevant dimensions that are differentiated to gain traction on the question?

Attempt to summarise the essence of each combination with a fresh perspective.





Criteria of a "good" quadrant

In his foreword to The Power of the 2 X 2 Matrix, **Joseph Gilmore** proposed that the matrix represents the most notable analytical tool ever to emerge in business management.

More recently, Venkatesh Rao argues: the quadrant diagram has achieved the status of an intellectual farce, providing mediocre consultants a picturesque path for their descent into madness.

Purpose is critical, as is the target audience.

Take time to frame the question. An issue that resonates and appeals to hearts not just minds.

What research has been conducted on this topic?

Which big hitting dimensions get to the heart of the issue?

Can we label the four boxes to differentiate patterns of activity?

Is there an actionable insight emerging from the grid?
